

service member/dependent(s) occupy temporary quarters in the Continental United States (CONUS) due to a PCS move. TLE reimbursement is limited to 10 days for a PCS to the new CONUS duty station. A Soldier may split the days among the old duty station and the new duty station. Temporary quarters for the soldier/dependents must be in the vicinity of the old and/or new duty station. Lodging receipts are required for reimbursement. When staying with friends/relatives, lodging cost is not authorized, however the TLE meal portion is payable. Please see your local military finance office or Wounded Warrior Pay Management Team for more details.

PCS Travel for Soldiers Injured in Combat Zones

Need to Know

This brochure provides explanations of travel pay for U.S. Army personnel injured while serving in a Combat Zone Tax Exclusion (CZTE) area who have been PCS'd to a military medical treatment facility outside the CZTE area. This also includes travel pay for family members PCSing to the medical treatment facility.

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Permanent Change of Station (PCS) travel pay for Soldiers injured in combat zones

Members of the U.S. Army deployed to a combat zone are entitled to a daily incidental expense (\$3.50) while overseas, with additional entitlements when there is a permanent change of station (PCS) to the medical treatment facility. PCS entitlements are also payable for dependents that have/are PCS'd to the medical treatment facility.

This brochure contains important information you need to know to ensure you understand your travel entitlements and how to obtain authorized travel pay.

What is a Permanent Change of Station (PCS)?

A permanent change of station is an official move from a previous duty station on official written orders to relocate to a new permanent duty station. Travel pay entitlements are paid based on official orders to relocate and arrival of the Soldier and their dependents at the new duty station.

What entitlements are associated with a PCS?

Examples of possible expenses that may be authorized for reimbursement with a PCS move are:

- Soldier and dependent travel
- Transportation allowances
- Household Goods (HHG)

- Privately Owned Vehicle (POV) transportation allowances
- Dislocation Allowance (DLA)
- Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE)

Soldier's and Dependents' Travel Allowances and Transportation Entitlements

If you use your own Privately Owned Vehicle (POV) you are entitled to flat per diem. The flat rate per diem is equal to the standard Continental United States (CONUS) per diem rate and is paid for each authorized travel day(s). Depending on the circumstances of travel, a different percentage of the flat rate is paid for each dependent.

When the Soldier and family travel together...

- ...the Soldier is entitled to **100%**
- ...dependents 12 years and older are entitled to **75%**
- ...dependents 11 years and younger are entitled to **50%**

When the Soldier and family travel separately...

- ...the Soldier is entitled to **100%**
- ...the oldest dependent is entitled to **100%**
- ...dependents 12 years and older are entitled to **75%**
- ...dependents 11 years and younger are entitled to **50%**

Mileage Allowance in Lieu of Transportation (MALT) is payable with pre-established rates being paid to the Soldier and their dependents. When a Soldier and their dependents relocate on a Soldiers PCS move, reimbursement is authorized for two Privately Owned Conveyances (POC), if used. PCS travel by POC is always more advantageous to the Government. A Soldier and their dependents traveling by POC are authorized MALT. MALT is paid on a "per mile" basis for the official distance from the old Permanent Duty Station (PDS) and the new duty station. The current rate for each POC is \$0.15 a mile. An additional \$.02 per mile is payable for each dependent, not to exceed \$0.20 per POC.

What am I entitled to for my household goods movement?

Household Goods (HHG) Transportation and Storage is authorized when a Soldier is on official PCS orders. A Soldier's HHG weight and allowances depend on the Soldier's grade and dependency status. Please see your local military transportation office for full and complete limitations and authorizations for all HHG movement, to include self procured/ Do-it-Yourself (DITY) moves. If the Soldier elects to choose government sponsored shipping through the local transportation office, no household good reimbursement will be paid through Travel Pay Operations.

What is DLA?

Dislocation Allowance (DLA) is an entitlement to help offset the cost incurred when moving to a new duty station. The DLA rate paid is based on the Soldier's grade and dependent status on the effective date of the PCS order.

When the dependents are authorized travel, but do not move with the Soldier, DLA at the without-dependent rate may be paid if the Soldier is not assigned Government Quarters at the new duty station. If the dependents later join the member and are authorized travel at Government expense, the Soldier may be paid the difference between the DLA at the with-dependent rate and the without-dependent rate. There are certain requirements that determine the rate at which the DLA is authorized. Please contact your local military finance office or a Wounded Warrior Pay Management Team for further details.

What is TLE?

Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE) is intended to partially pay for lodging/meal expenses when a
